

John Traill: Conductor



John Traill specialises in conducting symphonic and contemporary repertoire, and he is committed to making music accessible to all. Director and Supernumerary Fellow in Music at St Anne's College, Oxford, he has been course director of courses in Instrumental Conducting, and Orchestration, at Oxford University. From 2017-2020 he was a Teaching Fellow at Royal Holloway University London, responsible for courses in ensemble performance, conducting, and composition. Previous posts include Teaching Fellow at Kings College London, lecturer at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama and Bristol University, and Head of Performance at Bangor University. In January 2022 John became a Professor at the Royal Military School of Music.

Phil Cheesman: Narrator

Mild-mannered professional nerd Phil has a long history of amateur performing, starting with ballet at age three, then picking up all sorts of instruments and theatre skills through school and university and beyond.

The intervening decades have seen him appear on stage in various guises and a wide range of bands, one highlight being soloing with Dave Brubeck.

These days he can be found playing piano at church, accordion in a Bluegrass band, board games in the pub or silly video games with his kids.

Phil counts it an enormous privilege to have had such a long association with the CSO and greatly enjoys the opportunity to lark around narrating these concerts, helping bring their splendid music to life in such a fun way!
